SOLAR SUCCESS SPOTLIGHT YEAH Philly | Pennsylvania



YEAH Philly, a youth empowerment organization in West Philadelphia, celebrated their 12 kW solar array in October 2025. With 27 solar panels, the system will save the organization an estimated \$85,000 over its lifetime.

Thanks to **Billie Eilish** and her fans, through Eilish's Changemaker Program, a grant was made to RE-volv via REVERB, helping YEAH Philly go solar and achieve these savings.

This project was a collaboration between Good Energy Collaborative, GreenBrilliance, and RE-volv.

SOLAR + STORAGE MICROGRID SPOTLIGHT

Occidental Arts & Ecology Center (OAEC) | California



OAEC is an 80-acre research, demonstration, advocacy, and organizing center in Sonoma County, California. The 124 kW solar and 540 kWh battery microgrid system enables OAEC to save more than \$2 million over the next 25 years and keep the lights on during frequent power outages.
